After the deliberation was over, it was open to discussion among all in terms of interaction session. In this context, the other students of the class raised the following important questions-

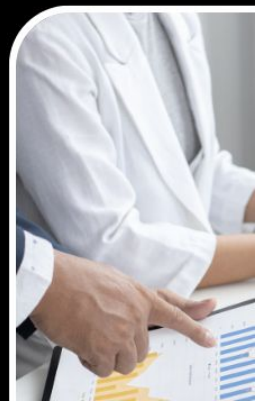
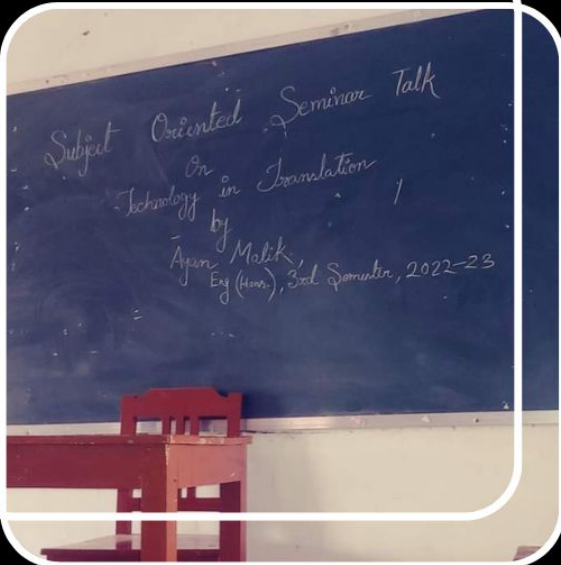
1. What is CAT?
